# TRUSTING GOD

## 3-A TRUSTING GOD'S POWER

While on Earth, Jesus taught many **disciples**. One of Jesus' closest disciples was a man named Peter, and he learned to trust Jesus in an amazing way.

# 3-B TRUSTING GOD'S LOVE

Jesus told people about God's love, and He also *showed* them God's love by doing kind things. He healed people and served them. He had compassion even for people that everyone else hated.

To explain His kind of love, Jesus told a **parable** about a lost son and a forgiving father.

God is more loving than any human. If humans can show love like the father in this parable, then God can, too.

So why did Jesus care for people who did wrong? Because He wanted them to come back to God, our Father.
