## **BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW SHAPING**

## IN Writing & Grammar 10

Words are weighty. Through words God spoke creation into existence. Through words God communicated to man by prophets. Through words man communicates with God in prayer. And through words the gospel is declared and believed.

Yet Eve was also deceived through words. False prophets use words to lead people away from the truth. The Bible compares harsh words with sword thrusts (Prov. 12:18) and devastating fires (James 3:5-6).

The power of words for good or evil makes worldview instruction critical to language study. Students must work hard to harness English for the glory of God and the good of others. Writing & Grammar 10 continues to emphasize the four biblical worldview themes found in Writing & Grammar 9, albeit with a different focus.

#### IDENTITY

People are made in God's image; thus, their writing should accurately reflect His values. But most people reject this purpose and pursue radical self-expression, aiming to make sin attractive in the content and style of their writing.



#### LOGIC

God expects people to follow His loving example of communicating logically. In contrast, many people today use logic as a weapon for manipulating people and legitimizing falsehood.

#### INTEGRITY

God requires people to respect and show grace toward one another despite their differences. Yet many people show dishonor and disregard for the truth, its Source, and His image-bearers, desiring to win arguments at any cost.
