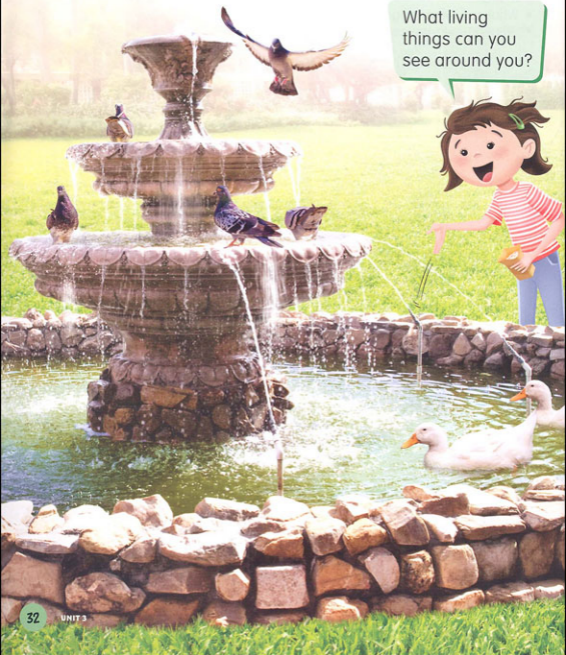

What do living things need to live?

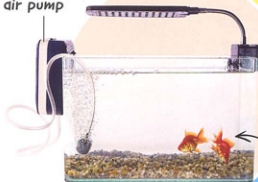
