In single-syllable words, the ending -al has a short-a sound and says /ăl/. In multisyllabic words, the ending -al has a schwa sound and says /əl/.

Example: final

A **schwa** /ə/ is a vowel sound similar to the short-u sound in up. It is found only in unaccented syllables of multisyllabic words.

In single-syllable words, the ending -ic has a short-i sound and says /ĭk/. In multisyllabic words, the ending -ic also has a short-i sound and says /ĭk/.
