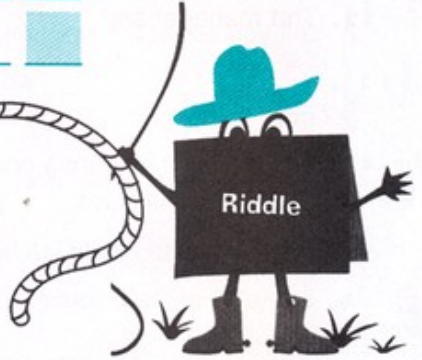

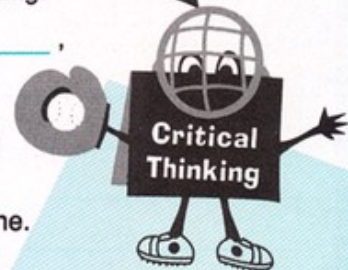

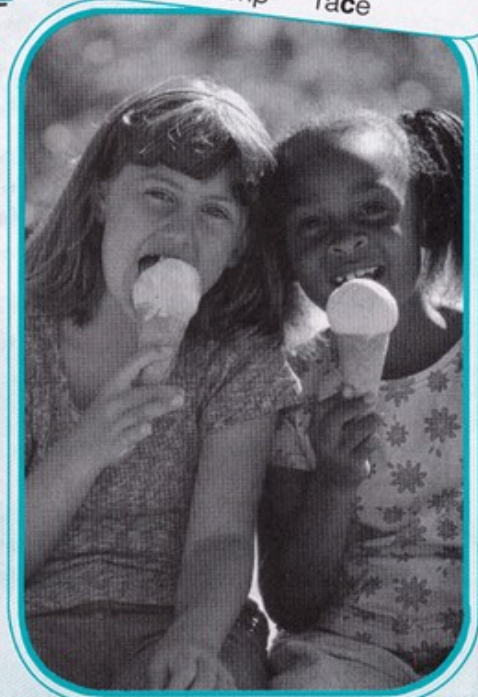

People in America love to eat ice cream. We produce and consume more ice cream than any other country in the world. Americans from the past loved ice cream as much as we do today. George Washington and Thomas Jefferson were no exceptions. Ice cream was served as a dessert course when each man was president. At that time, ice cream was considered a treat reserved for special celebrations because it was so hard to make. Ice needed to be cut from frozen ponds to keep the confection cold.

After the ice cream freezer was invented, ice cream vendors could sell all kinds of new treats. The ice cream cone was invented at the 1904 World's Fair, when a vendor ran out of dishes and placed the ice cream in a rolled up waffle instead. His customers thought that this was an excellent idea, and it remains a popular combination today!
