Even if you rated your picture a 10, your picture or “creation” is not on the level of God’s creation. His creation was an actual reflection of His own power and goodness. Since God is good, His creation was also good. Creation was “good” in an entirely different way than we think of the word *good*. None of the curses of sin were present. There was only God’s beautiful presence with His magnificent creation.

- 24 O LORD, how manifold are thy works! in wisdom hast thou made them all: the earth is full of thy riches.
- 26 There go the ships: there is that leviathan, whom thou hast made to play therein.
- 27 These wait all upon thee; that thou mayest give them their meat in due season.
- 28 That thou givest them they gather: thou openest thine hand, they are filled with good.
- 29 Thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: thou takest away their breath, they die, and return to their dust.
- 30 Thou sendest forth thy spirit, they are created: and thou renewest the face of the earth.
- 31 The glory of the LORD shall endure for ever: the LORD shall rejoice in his works.
- 32 He looketh on the earth, and it trembleth: he toucheth the hills, and they smoke.
- 33 I will sing unto the LORD as long as I live: I will sing praise to my God while I have my being.
- 34 My meditation of him shall be sweet: I will be glad in the LORD.
- 35 Let the sinners be consumed out of the earth, and let the wicked be no more. Bless thou the LORD, O my soul. Praise ye the LORD.



After reading Psalm 104, you should be struck by how many times God is given the glory for *His* creation. Not only did He create, but also what He created is magnificent down to the smallest element. All creation declares God's glory!
