Updates

The revised edition now features six units (up from four) and includes a fifteen-lesson novel study of *The Sword in the Tree* by Clyde Robert Bulla to increase academic rigor. Some reading selections were replaced for academic standard or copyright reasons. A new teaching cycle, BWS unit openers, and a greater emphasis on phonemic awareness and phonics have been added. Differentiated phonics, a phonics monitoring tool, and new phonics lessons that cater to individual learning needs have been added. The design now aligns with the revised Writing & Grammar 2, and literary and reasoning skills have been introduced.

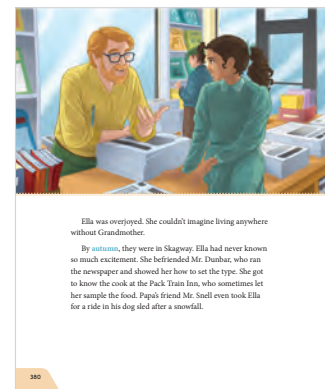
